Safety in the Hills



Leave a route card or other indication of your likely location with a responsible person, and notify this person immediately of your safe return.

Where

This is a circular walk from Lixwm via Ysceifiog Village along footpaths, bridleways and country roads.

Refreshments

Crown Inn, Lixwm and The Fox, Ysceifiog

1. From the Crown Inn car park turn left down hill along the B5121. Continue through the village and turn left into Ffordd Walwen.

2. Continue to sharp left hand bend and take footpath to the right, between the houses, until you find first stile.

3. Cross this stile and the one in sight and continue along the path through the wood to the road, Ffordd Y Graig, and turn right after passing through the metal gate.

4. Follow Ffordd Y Graig until you reach the B5121. Cross the road into lane opposite and pass the farm (dogs on lead please here due to cattle in fields)

5. When you find the fork in the path continue straight on along the narrowest of the paths. It has a sign to the left of it prohibiting motor vehicles.

6. Follow this path until you reach the narrow single lane and houses on the right and follow the road to the right.



7. At the T junction turn right and follow lane into village of Ysceifiog. This is the only steep part of this walk.

8. Enter the village and turn right at the T junction towards the village centre.

9. The Fox at Ysceifiog is open most days and is a free house dating back to 1730's. It has received several CAMRA awards for best local real ale pub. (Please check opening times prior to visiting)

10. Once you have passed through the village with the Fox Inn and village hall on your left, continue up the road, bearing right with the Church on your right until you reach the first lane on the right, Ffordd Gledlom. Turn down this lane, which is the start of the return leg back into Lixwm Village.

11. This part of the return visit offers great views of the Clwydian Range and the rolling farmland leading up to the ridge line. The hedgerows offer wild foods when in season including, blackberries, raspberries, alpine strawberries and gooseberries to name just a few, and cobnuts if you can beat the squirrels!

12. At the first farm the road continues on with a bridleway either side forming a cross roads. Continue along the road. However if you want to make slightly longer turn left and follow the bridleway. Details of this route are covered in another walk so make sure you use a map.



13. This is the entrance back into the village and the last couple of hundred metres left. Continue along the lane with the school on the right and Chapel on the left. When you arrive at the T junction turn right. The end of the walk and Crown Inn are visible on left.
